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2. Minutes of last meeting

3. Matters arising from minutes

Staffing formulae – Yvonne MacRae submitted Freedom of Information requests to all the local authorities in Scotland to find out about teacher staffing allocations in other small secondary schools for comparison. Other secondary schools with a pupil roll of less than 100 pupils were identified in the Shetland Islands, Orkney Islands, Western Isles, Dumfries and Galloway, and Argyll and Bute. Some were junior schools up to S4. All but one school has a more generous staffing allocation, the exemption being a junior school which does not require S5-6 subjects to be taught so not comparable. The details have been shared with the management team in the hope that this might support their staffing discussions with Highland Council going forward to secure a more stable baseline staff.

4. Head Teacher's Reports

Mr Naples-Campbell thanked Mr Graeme Smart for his work at NWSS. He expressed his awareness of the issues that the school has and continues to face. Mr Naples-Campbell shared his Head Teacher's report. Information within this report has been divided amongst the appropriate headings below. The report was received positively by all parents present. He also shared the new Learning & Teaching Policy for the High School and his proposed curriculum rationale moving forward.

Pupil attendance has improved with all pupils attending school this week – well done all!

Staffing

- Aileen MacDonald is on a secondment as Acting Head Teacher for Achiltibuie and Lochinver Primary School cluster.
- Staffing levels are good.
- No advertised posts.
- Extra PSA hours from our PEF plan and they were allocated to PSAs currently employed.

- Gail Ross has informed me she is planning to retire however Murdette Price
 Davies is currently doing the role to support the ASN dept. (Parent Council
 will support a community collection for a gift for Gail Ross as a thank you for

- C MacLean joined us at the start of the term to teach Gaelic on a 0.2 contract

Professional Development of Staff

- We have looked at our curriculum rationale and the need for it to be updated and relevant – curriculum rationale document explains the proposed new curriculum structure and content. (This was discussed and received positively by the Parent Council.)
- There's been an authority focus on Learning and Teaching and what that should look like in our schools. Draft Learning and Teaching policy.
- Middle Leaders focus on their role and the standards from the GTCS
- We have two working groups this year to help support our School Improvement Plan – one is on rights respecting schools and the other is looking at our place within the local community. I will be inviting interests from parents who may wish to join that working group to help with our school improvement plan.

School Ethos

- SLT Staff Drop in and visibility around the school
- Weekly staff bulletin email across the whole campus
- Assemblies One per month. First one focused on Respect and the second on Community
- Attendance implemented the Highland attendance policy and this week we have had 100% attendance
- Head Teacher Drop in Sessions for Parents have started. This will continue once a month
- Trips Hamden Trip. Shegra with English, Science field trips, Football tournament, and Culloden Battle Field next week and with Sunshine on Leith happening tonight.
- Aspiration is playing a big part in our discussions with students this academic year young people need to start taking a lead in their own learning.
- Pupil Council has been discussed with a thought to make it wider across the campus (currently just open to P7-S6) but making it a pupil parliament to help with pupil empowerment and open to P1 – S6
- Two students will be selected to attend the Lessons from Auschwitz project later this year. (Since meeting it has been announced that Harvey Macdonald, S5, and Keira Czerwik, S6, will be attending. Well done both!)

Curricular:

- We have introduced Travel and Tourism to S1 and S2
- We have introduced Humanitarian Education across all year groups
- Gaelic has been introduced for the BGE
- Staff have backed the move to a 2+2+2 model. (Shared S1/2 classes, S3/4 classes and shared S5/6 classes.)

Childsmile: Tooth Brushing Programme

We plan to start the Childsmile toothbrushing programme again in school. The dental nurse has visited Kinlochbervie and Scourie to start the programme with class visits about toothbrushing. We hope to arrange a visit for Durness too (it is part of the north visits). This is seen as a key part of the Scottish Government's oral health programme and an important way to promote children's health in schools. The aim is to establish toothbrushing as a regular healthy habit.

<u>NWSS Thursdays</u>: The Thursday timetable for NWSS Primary seems to be working well. The days are busy! We have added Spanish lessons to the timetable this year with Mr Sisdeli. Kodaly music (P3/4) and Youth Music Initiative (P5/6) will also be on Thursdays for a couple of blocks throughout the year.

Mr Campbell has been leading monthly assemblies to support the Rights Respecting Schools programme.

P7 pupils are following HS times for break and lunch. Their timetable includes science and numeracy with high school teachers. P7 pupils are also able to visit the Big Blue Box at lunchtimes, spend time in the library or join Mr Macrae for badminton.

Managers Support visit to Durness and Scourie Nurseries

Both settings recently had a visit from Early Years Area Support Officers. It is worth sharing a lovely comment made by the managers after their visit.

It really was a pleasure to talk with such a dedicated staff within both of your settings who strive to do their very best for their children.

<u>Scourie Nursery Building Work:</u> The works are sitting with the Estates Team currently and Education have been working hard with Senior Managers to try and move these forward as soon as possible. The Estate Team are waiting for the budget to be approved for the building work to begin. This would need to be in school holidays.

In the meantime, ELC staff have worked really hard to create the best possible temporary space for the two ELC children in Scourie. This includes the outdoor play areas too.

<u>Inservice CPD</u>: <u>ELC</u> staff attended two CPD courses on the recent inservice days: Rights Respecting Schools and ELCs and ELC Planning.

<u>Together Days</u>: We are planning to have a nursery together day each term. The first one will be 31st October in Durness Nursery... Which just happens to be Hallowe'en so they'll be lots of Hallowe'en themed activities. Transport will be via the school car with ELC staff and travel time will be within nursery times.
